






The findings on evidence-based practice that supports the connection of the medical model with the concept of humanization in caregiving

# Humanization as an invisible but always present concept

- 1. Insiderness/Objectification
- 2. Agency/Passivity
- 3. Uniqueness/Homogenization
- 4. Togetherness/Isolation
- 5. Sense-making/Loss of meaning
- 6. Personal journey/ Loss of personal journey
- 7. Sense of place/Dislocation
- 8. Embodiment/Reductionist body

# Incorporating elements of humanization in caregiving

Respect for users dignity, uniqueness, individuality and humanity, as well as adequate working conditions and suficient human and material resources are the key elements of humanization of care.



An empathetic and respectful approach to users, sufficient human and material resources in home environment, and a balanced workload for caregivers are important prerequisites for establishing meaningful, mutually beneficial relationships with service users and delivering humanized care.



It is not that humanization of social and healthcare is not important; clearly it is, as evidenced by recent policy documents that hightlight professional compassion, dignity in care and greater users choice.
